

Welcome to Joseph P. Riley, Jr. Park for the second part of the opening homestand of the month of June! The RiverDogs have 10 home games remaining during the month and this four-game series features a visit from the Asheville Tourists (Colorado Rockies affiliate). The RiverDogs hope to rebound from a poor month of May at The Joe. The RiverDogs started the month off right and did take the first game of this homestand in dramatic fashion, when Austin Aune hit a two-run, walk-off homer in the bottom of the 12th inning of Monday's game against the Augusta GreenJackets.

The R'Dogs and Tourists have played just three games against one another in one series at McCormick Field, April 28 - April 30. Asheville took the first two games of the series, 5-1 and 9-6, but Charleston bounced back with a 5-4 win in the series finale. Asheville is the host city of the 2015 South Atlantic League All-Star Game, which will take place on June 23 at 7:35 p.m. from McCormick Field.



MLB: NEW YORK YANKEES

The Yankees have split the first six games of their seven-game west coast swing. They dropped three games against the Oakland A's, but rebounded with two wins against the Mariners in the first two games of their three-game series. Outfielder Ramon Flores was called up to the big leagues when Slade Heathcott was placed on the DL; Flores played for Charleston in 2010-11.



TRIPLE-A: SCRANTON/WILKES-BARRE RAILRIDERS



The RailRiders have ascended to second place in the International League's North Division with a 27-26 record, 1.5 games out of first behind the Rochester Red Wings. Ben Gamel leads the team with a .321 average. He has collected a team-high 52 hits and is hitting .475 against lefties.

DOUBLE-A: TRENTON THUNDER

The Thunder are now just four games out of first place behind the New Britain Rock Cats in the Eastern Division of the Eastern League. Eric Jagielo and Aaron Judge are second and third in the league with nine and eight home runs, respectively. Judge is second in the league in total bases with 96.



SINGLE-A ADVANCED: TAMPA YANKEES

The Tampa Yankees stand alone in third place in the Florida State League's Northern Division with a 25-26 record, 6.5 games back of the Daytona Tortugas. Former RiverDogs shortstop Tyler Wade wowed fans in Charleston and is doing the same in Tampa with a .313 batting average in 40 FSL Games this season. He is also two stolen bases behind the league leader with 18 thefts on the season.


SOUTH ATLANTIC LEAGUE (A)

The league announced that Asheville's Omar Carrizales and Hickory's Ariel Jurado have been named South Atlantic League Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively. In seven games, Carrizales hit .516, he was 16-for-31, with 2 double, 2 triples, 2 RBI, 6 runs, and 1 walk. Jurado went 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA. In 12.0 innings, he didn't allow a run on five hits, he walked two batters and struck out nine.

MONTGOMERY PROMOTED TO TAMPA





Montgomery dazzled in nine starts with the Charleston RiverDoas

The RiverDogs pitching staff has been outstanding during the 2015 season. Anchoring the staff has been lefty Jordan Montgomery.

Montgomery was named Pitcher of the Week in the South Atlantic League for May 18-24. After one more start with Charleston, Montgomery received some great news. He will be making his next outing with Class A Advanced Tampa in the Florida State League.

"It was good to see that my hard work was being recognized," Montgomery said after his promotion was announced Monday. "I put together two good starts and really figured it out. I am excited to get on that seven-hour ride and get there as soon as I can."

Montgomery is the third RiverDogs pitcher and fifth player to be called up to Tampa so far this season. Pitching coach Tim Norton is proud of what the southpaw has accomplished here in Charleston.

"He is a tough guy to lose," Norton said. "But we want to lose people. We want to get them to the next level. He always set the tone, threw strikes, and attacked guys. He went about it the right way."

In nine starts with the RiverDogs, Montgomery led the team and was third in the South Atlantic League with 55 strikeouts. By comparison, he only walked 12 batters. Montgomery did not issue any free passes in his two starts the week of May 18 and only allowed one in his most recent start at Savannah last Friday.

"To move to the next level, you have to be a strike-thrower," Norton said. "That is something that Montgomery and [Cale] Coshow did well. They didn't put a lot of guys on base, they struck a lot of people out, and they showed up every day ready to work."

To be called up to the next level, Norton emphasized one major point: consistency. Montgomery averaged 6.1 strikeouts per game and only 1.3 walks per outing. He did not allow more than four earned runs and seven hits in a start this season.

Coshow posted very similar statistics coming out of the bullpen for Charleston earlier this season. He had a 27-to-6 strikeout-to-walk ratio, nearly identical to Montgomery's 55-to-12. Coshow was also a perfect seven-for-seven in save opportunities.

"It's all about being consistent," Norton said. "You can't afford to have one good game, then a couple bad ones, and then put it back together. The guys who are consistent and doing well are the ones who get out of here."

Montgomery had a month and a half to enjoy playing baseball back in his home state. The Sumter, S.C., native played college baseball at the University of South Carolina and made his highly anticipated return to the Palmetto State this season. Montgomery only made two of his nine starts at The Joe, but he won both of them.



On April 12, Montgomery did not allow an earned run and struck out a career-high nine batters in a 4-2 victory over Lexington. He impressed the home fans once again on May 3

when he held Hickory, the best team in the South Atlantic League, scoreless in six innings of work.

"I'm sure my family will come and visit me in Tampa," Montgomery said. "But they are not going to be able to come to every game I pitch like they did here. I even got to see my baby niece born while I was here. But I did my time here and now I am ready to go to Tampa."

While he will miss spending extra time around his family, Montgomery is pleased to be progressing in the Yankees' organization and glad that his time has come to move up to Tampa. Norton is hoping the other young pitchers on Charleston's staff will learn lessons from players who get called up to the next level, like Montgomery and Coshow.

"I'm trying to steer these guys in the right direction and get them to the next level so they can help us at the Major League level as soon as possible," Norton said. "I am excited for Montgomery. He is a real hard worker. He did a great job with me last summer in Staten Island and just continued to have success. I am happy for him."

Montgomery will make his first appearance with Tampa in the upcoming week. He will reunite with Coshow, Chaz Hebert, and Abiatal Avelino who also began the 2015 season on the River-Dogs' roster. Ty McFarland was not on Charleston's Opening Day roster, but he appeared in seven games with the R'Dogs in early May before being called up to Tampa on May 11.

GET TO KNOW THE JOE

Named for Charleston's long-serving mayor, Joseph P. Riley, Jr. Park proudly opened its gates in 1997 presiding over the banks of the Ashley River. Home to both the Charleston RiverDogs and The Citadel Bulldogs baseball teams, "The Joe" as it's affectionately known, has played host to thousands of baseball games, and countless special events.

Mayor Riley, an avid baseball fan, is often in attendance having escaped the pressures of directing one of the nation's most historic cities. He is one of the city's great promoters of the game of baseball, and despite his objections, the city council voted unanimously to name the facility in his honor.



Riley Park was designed by HOK Sports, of Kansas City, MO., known primarily for their work at Oriole Park at Camden Yards (Baltimore), Jacobs Field (Cleveland) and Coors Field (Denver), among many others. The facility is unique in several ways - visually, of course - however, its uniqueness stems from the relationships fostered by the City of Charleston, the state of South Carolina (The Citadel) and a private enterprise (RiverDogs).

While Riley Park is indeed fan-friendly, the facility was designed with the spectators' needs in mind. From nearly every spot in the facility, fans can get to a restroom or a concession stand within a 45-second walk. Parking is also within several minutes' walk to the front gate and is considered one of the safest places in downtown Charleston as the Police Department is located directly across the street from Riley Park.

New this season is a brand new, state of the art wide screen videoboard that provides over 1,032 square feet of viewing area and is one of the largest boards in all of Minor League Baseball. In 2006, Mike Williams was hired as the head groundskeeper. Williams previously was the head groundskeeper for the New York Mets and Tampa Bay Devil Rays.

Riley Park has consistently been rated among the best playing facilities on the collegiate and minor league levels, and once you've visited The loe, you will concur. Welcome to Joseph P. Riley, Jr. Park, and enjoy today's game!

Q: You were drafted twice, in 2011 by the Cardinals out of High School and last year by the Yankees. What went into the decision to go to school and not play pro ball right away?

A: First, family played a big part in the decision. We discussed everything—whether to go or not—and playing at Alabama was always my lifelong dream. So when Alabama came and offered me a scholarship, boy that really made me realize that I had accomplished something. Talking with my dad, I thought that going to Alabama I would be able to mature a little as a player and a person. Just the little things I learned there, which high school kids don't get to go through because they didn't play in college.



A: The approaches get a lot better. You can't get away with as many mistakes here as you can in college. You can leave a high fastball in college and get away with it, but here 6 out of 10 times it's going to get hit pretty hard – so the little mistakes you can't get away with them here as much.

Q: What have been the highlights of your career both collegiately and professionally?

A: I threw a complete game against LSU my Junior Year – 9 innings 92 pitches – 22 fly balls with the metal bats, that's a pretty cool one from college. Professionally, during this past spring training I pitched and Alex Rodriguez played third, I thought that was pretty neat.

Q: You were here with the RiverDogs at the end of last year, and to start this year. What has been your favorite part about Charleston both on and off the field?

A: On the field the fans are tremendous, by far the best fans I've played in front of in the minor leagues and, as a pitcher, I love how the wind blows in here all of the time. Off the field, Charleston is just such a gorgeous city. You've got the water, downtown is pretty, the food is amazing – it's just a really great place to be.



Former RiverDogs pitcher Eric Ruth has an unblemished record in 10 starts this season with Double-A Trenton and Class A Advanced Tampa.

Ruth began the season making one start for Trenton on April 12, a result of the Yankees shuffling their roster after a 19-inning marathon against the Red Sox on April 10. Ruth returned to Tampa after his first outing and made his next four starts with the T-Yanks. He picked up one win and had a 3.27 ERA, allowing eight runs in 22 innings pitched.

The second week in May, Ruth was promoted to Trenton once again and has been very impressive. The righty has won three of his five starts, including both of his last two. In a May 20 outing against Bowie, Ruth held the Baysox scoreless for seven innings and only gave up one hit. He has lowered his ERA to 2.04 with 20 strikeouts.



"I like to think I'm a pretty flexible quy," Ruth said in an interview with Sam Dykstra of MiLB.com. "I want to be able to do whatever the organization needs me to be. I can't just be single-minded, and I don't really mind one over the other, to be honest."

Ruth was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on June 14, 2013. The Harleysville, Pa., native played his college baseball in the Palmetto State at Winthrop University in Rock Hill, S.C. Ruth finished his four-year career at Winthrop with a 13-4 record as a reliever his freshman, sophomore, and senior year and a starter his junior year.
